

British Council organizes Management Week – a series of experiential learning workshops for working professionals

Innovative series of professional development workshops promoting lifelong learning

Kolkata, 09 September 2019: British Council in Kolkata is organizing **Management Week** for young corporate and academic professionals to help them develop skills for the future through a series of experiential workshops. Starting from 16th to 19th September, these workshops are aimed to impart skills required in the dynamic work environment of today to foster employability and an upward career progression among young working professionals.

The Management Week consists of four varying experiential training programmes – ‘D-I-Y Power Tools for Managers’, ‘The Communicator’, ‘Unlock Your Creativity’ and ‘Train the Trainer’. These workshops are designed to be participant-focused with unique teaching methodology that comprises of discussions, role-plays, pair tasks and group work.

The Management week will close with a special inspiring talk called ‘The 9th Habit’ by internationally renowned speaker, author and storyteller - Jeroninio ‘Jerry’ Almeida. The 9th Habit is Jerry’s research over 21 years of several thousand books and research papers which he covers in his self-help books ‘Karma Kurry’ and ‘moJOshInspirator’. In this talk, Jerry explains how we need to unpack the five elements of **SAVED**; an acronym for Skills, Attitude, Values, Ethics and Deeds; to understand the way to live a life of purpose, gratitude and daily contributions.
