'MOITRI' - The First Ever Indo-Bangladesh Friendship Motoring Drive 2020 To Commemorate The Birth Centenary Of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Flagged Off Ceremonially

 Aimed At Promoting Road Safety, Strengthening Bilateral Ties and Conservation, The Route Will Cover Extensive Stretches Of Bangladesh Finally Concluding At Siliguri -

Kolkata, 28th February, 2020: The ceremonial flagging off of 'MOITRI' - the first ever Indo-Bangladesh Friendship Motoring Drive 2020 took place amid huge enthusiasm at Calcutta Club today. Present on the occasion were Mr Md Mofakharul Iqbal, First Secretary (Press), Bangladesh Deputy High Commission- Kolkata, Ms Rachana Banerjee, Renowned Actress, Ms Simran Virk, Secretary General, Federation of Indian Automobile Associations (FIAA) and Mr Milon Mukherjee, Chairman, Automobile Association of Eastern India (AAEI) among others. A yellow taxi, befittingly decked up for the occasion with pictures of the stalwarts from both nations, will lead the drive in India.

The Rally with 21 cars will proceed to Bangladesh via Benapole border on 1st March, 2020 and end at Siliguri on 7th March, 2020 covering about 2000 Kms and touching Jessore-Dhaka-Commilla-Chitagong-Coxbazaar-Mymensingh and Rangpur en-route. The formal Flag off will take place in Bongaon on the morning of 1st March. On 2nd March the entire team will pay homage to Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman at Bangabandhu Memorial Museum in Dhanmondi. A joint cultural function has been planned in Dhaka and Chittagong as a part of this initiative.

"In our efforts towards advocacy of 'Safe, Clean, Fair and Green Mobility for all', we are proud to flag off 'Moitri', the first ever cross - country Motor Car Rally involving Bangladesh and India. The focal objective of 'Moitri' is to spread the Golden Rules of road safety amongst the masses of the two nations in commemoration to the birth centenary of revered and the great leader, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman", said Mr Milon Mukherjee, Chairman, Automobile Association of Eastern India (AAEI).

The rally falls in tune with the FIA's Action for Road Safety. FIA has been campaigning worldwide to create safe roads through various road safety measures. It is pertinent to note that 3500 lives including lives of 500 children are lost everyday throughout the world in road accidents. The major causes of road accidents are behavioural aspects that include negligence of road stakeholders and lack of proper knowledge on traffic safety rules and regulations. For past many years AAEI, as a part of its advocacy campaign for safer roads, has been adopting various Road Safety measures, in tune with the 'FIA Action for Road Safety' guidelines.

"The rally will also highlight that political border between the two Bengals can never erase the myth "Rice and Fish makes a Bengali".
