## **Kolkata Centre For Creativity Inaugurates The 6th AMI Arts Festival At The Indian Museum**

**21<sup>st</sup> November 2025, Kolkata:** The Kolkata Centre for Creativity (KCC), in collaboration with the Indian Museum and the Museum Association of Bengal, proudly inaugurate **Breathing (with) History - Celebrating Rural Heritage Stories**, a distinctive exhibition that brings India's rural cultural landscapes into renewed public focus. Presented as part of KCC's AMI Arts Festival 2025, the exhibition will be on view at the Indian Museum from 21 to 29 November 2025, along with collateral events such as workshops and round table discussions.

The inauguration ceremony was attended by Mr. Arijit Dutta Choudhury - Director, Indian Museum; Prof. Sachindranath Bhattacharya - President, West Bengal Museum Association; Dona Ganguly, renowned Odissi Dancer; Dr. Satyabrata Chakraborty, Former General Secretary of Asiatic Society, Kolkata; Prof. Soma Bandyopadhyay, Vice Chancellor, The West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning, And Administration, and Padmashri Awardee Baul Samrat Purnadas Baul.

The Exhibition, curated by Bihan Das, features almost 60 rural histories, and participating bodies extend beyond Eastern India and even beyond national borders. Contributors include the **Centre for the Study of Democracy, University of Westminster (UK)**, alongside institutions such as **IGNCA, NATMO**, organisations like **Kolkata Kotokotha**, and the Krishnanagar Museum, participating ahead of its public opening. Kolkata Centre for Creativity has invited 43+ museums and has provided travel grants to deepen their engagement.

**Richa Agarwal, Chairperson of KCC, highlighted the festival's focus on celebrating rural heritage** — “AMI Arts Festival has always been envisioned as a space for the cross-pollination of ideas, and this exhibition extends that spirit by bringing together a rich tapestry of rural heritage stories. These narratives ground us, reminding us of the communities and custodians who sustain our cultural memory with quiet commitment. It is a privilege to collaborate with the Indian Museum and support nearly 60 village-rooted histories this year. Through these collaborations, we hope to strengthen these ecosystems and deepen our shared responsibility to preserve and celebrate living heritage.”

The exhibition features a diverse array of artefacts and archival records that highlight Bengal's rural history and artistry, such as the ceramics of Chandraketurgarh, traditional scroll paintings from Pingla, West Midnapore districts, Bankura's terracotta, chau masks, Dokra art, traditional textiles, garments, accessories, and much more.

In addition to artefacts, the exhibition offers engaging workshops, live performances and panel discussions. These activities aim to foster a deeper understanding of rural traditions and their relevance in contemporary times.
